Max Liebermann (20 July 1847 – 8 February 1935) was a German painter, and one of the leading proponents of Impressionism in Germany and continental Europe. Liebermann studied art in Weimar, Paris, and the Netherlands. Liebermann returned to Berlin in 1884, where he remained for the rest of his life. He chooses aspects of his garden near Lake Wannsee, as motifs for his paintings.

In 1909, Liebermann bought a property in Wannsee, a wealthy suburb of summer homes. There he had a country house built for himself. The Liebermann Villa, is what he called his "Schloss am See". Liebermann felt comfortable there and particularly enjoyed his personal design. He particularly enjoyed the large garden, which he and Alfred Lichtwark designed.
